RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNING BOARD OF THE SANTA BARBARA COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT

RESOLUTION NO. 1 Resolution of Censure

WHEREAS: the Santa Barbara Community College District Board of Trustees maintains Board Policies and Administrative Procedures governing the District, including the Board of Trustees itself, and the District is subject to accreditation by the Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges; and

WHEREAS: the Board of Trustees expects all students and employees to abide by Board Policies and Administrative Procedures and it must abide by its own policies and procedures; and

WHEREAS: These policies are in place to encourage the respectful and orderly communication of the diverse viewpoints of the seven elected trustees; and

WHEREAS: These Board of Trustees wishes to hear and allow representation of all viewpoints and trustees, including Trustee Gallardo's; and

WHEREAS: The Board of Trustees is responsible for the successful accreditation of the college and must operate itself in a manner that is consistent with accreditation standards; and

WHEREAS: Board Policy 2715 includes provisions to rectify trustee behavior that is not aligned with policy or accreditation standards. These policies solely focus on behavior and the "how" of communication of a Trustee's viewpoint, not at all on the content of that viewpoint; and

WHEREAS: Trustee Gallardo has repeatedly violated board policies, specifically Board Policy 2715, 2200, and ACCJC Standard IV C 2 from September 2021-July 2023; and

WHEREAS: Board Presidents Haslund, Parker, and Abboud have reminded Trustee Gallardo of Board Policy 2715 and pointed out her specific violations of Board Policy 2715 by email and attempted to meet with her to reach a resolution for nearly two and a half years; and

WHEREAS: Trustee Gallardo has violated Board Policy 2715 by refusing to meet with the Board President in 2022 and 2023 at several opportunities. Board President Haslund in December 2021 organized a meeting with Trustee Gallardo and Superintendent/President Murillo to resolve issues of disrespectful communication by Trustee Gallardo towards the Superintendent/President. Despite the meeting, the behavior continued. See Exhibit A for additional specific citations; and

WHEREAS: Trustee Gallardo arrived late to 14 meetings and was entirely absent from 19 board/committee meetings from July 2021-July 2023 amounting to 52% of 63 total meetings,

in violation of Board Policy 2715. Several of these meetings included key topics of the board's purview such as selection/interview/deliberation of the Superintendent/President, labor negotiations, and potential litigation. By being absent, Trustee Gallardo deprived the board discussion and decision of her viewpoint. See Exhibit B for additional specific citations; and

WHEREAS: Trustee Gallardo interfered with the operations of the college and attempted to micromanage the activities of the Superintendent/President on several occasions, in violation of Board Policy 2715. Trustee Gallardo attempted to direct the implementation of Resolution 1 COVID-19 Vaccine Requirement, made unilateral demands of the Superintendent/President to discipline or terminate union-represented college employees, and attempted to direct the content of the college's website. See Exhibit C for additional specific citations; and

WHEREAS: Trustee Gallardo has communicated to the Superintendent/President in a rude and disrespectful manner at several instances over email, in public meetings, and in closed sessions, in violation of Board Policy 2715. This led to an unpleasant workplace environment for the Superintendent/President See Exhibit D for additional specific citations; and

WHEREAS: Trustee Gallardo has failed to uphold the principle, in Board Policy 2715 and ACCJC Standard IV C 2, that once the Board of Trustees has taken action it moves forward as a whole. Trustee Gallardo repeatedly raised the issue of Resolution 1 COVID-19 Vaccine Mandate at several meetings from September 2021-December 2022 during agenda items not at all related to that topic. Trustee Gallardo failed to adhere to Board Policy 2340 to work with the Board President and Superintendent to place on the agenda an item that allows for the constructive communication of her differing viewpoint. See Exhibit E for additional specific citations; and

WHEREAS: Trustee Gallardo's behavior has disrupted the smooth operations of the Board of Trustees, deprived the Board of her differing viewpoint, and harmed its relationship with the Superintendent/President; and

WHEREAS: on June 26th Board President Abboud emailed Trustee Gallardo an outline of her violation of Board Policies and Administrative Procedures and ACCJC Standard, Trustee Gallardo replied simply stating her disagreement and no intent to meet; and

WHEREAS: on July 6th 2023 Board President Abboud brought to the Board of Trustees consideration of forming an ad-hoc committee to investigate the violations outlined to Trustee Gallardo; and

WHEREAS: The ad-hoc committee met 4 times to plan its work and review the information gathered. In total, committee members worked over 200 hours separately to examine the violations brought forward and organize recommendations to the Board of Trustees; and

WHEREAS: The committee interviewed Superintendent/President Murillo, former Superintendent/President Helen Benjamin, and former Board Presidents Parker and Haslund in

order to hear recollections of specific instances in which Trustee Gallardo violated policies and standards; and

WHEREAS: The committee reviewed email communications between Trustee Gallardo, Superintendent/President Murillo, and the Board President from 2021-2023 in order to cite specific instances of violations of policies and standards; and

WHEREAS: The ad-hoc committee reviewed each committee and board meeting recording, a total of 62 meetings, from July 2021 to July 2023 to cite specific instances of public violations of policies and standards; and

WHEREAS: The ad-hoc committee came to the conclusion that Trustee Gallardo's violations of policies and standards have been severe, exposed the college to an accreditation violation, and could have been prevented if Trustee Gallardo was willing to communicate her viewpoint in a manner consistent with policies and standards.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: The Board of Trustees finds that Trustee Veronica Gallardo has repeatedly violated Board Policies and Administrative Procedures and Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges Standards; and

THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: The Exhibits attached and referenced in this resolution are incorporated as part of the resolution; and

THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: The Board of Trustees censures Trustee Veronica Gallardo and disapproves of her behavior and repeated violation of Board Policies and Administrative Procedures and Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges Standard IV C 2, C 7, C 11, C 12 and all accreditation requirements; and

THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:

- 1. Trustee Gallardo shall be ineligible for committee membership, board officer roles, and conference travel until such time as approved by the Board of Trustees at the end of twelve months. The board shall appoint an ad-hoc committee at that time to review the past year of behavior and make a recommendation to the Board of Trustees.
- 2. Trustee Gallardo shall make a public apology to Superintendent/President Kindred Murillo for her disrespectful behavior, and to the Board of Trustees for violation of Board Policies and Administrative Procedures and ACCJC Accreditation Standards.

3. Trustee Gallardo shall immediately and at all times going forward treat the Superintendent/President, College employees and fellow Board members with respect, speak with civility, and cease unilaterally directing the Superintendent/President with regard to operational matters.

4. Trustee Gallardo shall participate in four free remote webinars offered by the CCLC within the next twelve months on the following topics: Ethics and Board Roles & amp; Responsibilities.

5. Trustee Gallardo shall immediately and at all times going forward attend each regularly scheduled meeting, respond to special meeting availability polls within 24 hours, and arrive on time to all board meetings. In the event of a special circumstance Trustee Gallardo shall contact the Board President in advance regarding any conflict affecting her ability to attend.

6. Trustee Gallardo shall immediately and at all times going forward communicate her valued viewpoint in a manner consistent with Board Policies and Administrative Procedures and ACCJC Accreditation Standards.

7. Trustee Gallardo shall include the Board President in all meetings she has with the Superintendent/President and in all emails she sends to the Superintendent/President.

Exhibit A Statement of Authorities and Evidence

I. Violation of BP 2715: Refusal to Meet with the Board President regarding alleged violations of Board policies and Accreditation Standards in an effort to reach a resolution violates BP 2715 and Accreditation Standards IV C. 7 and 11.

<u>Authorities</u>

Violations of Accreditation Standards threaten the accreditation of the entire college. Loss of accreditation effectively closes the college for all students because it results in the loss of financial aid for students at the college and renders all courses and degrees ineligible for credit at other institutions of higher learning.

Accreditation Standards: (June 2014, currently applicable)

"Introduction

The primary purpose of an ACCJC–accredited institution is to foster student learning and student achievement. . . .There are four Standards that work together to define and promote student success, academic quality, institutional integrity, and excellence. . . .

Standard IV: Leadership and Governance

...Governance roles are defined in policy and are designed to facilitate decisions that support student learning programs and services and improve institutional effectiveness, while acknowledging the designated responsibilities of the governing board and the chief executive officer. Through established governance structures, processes, and practices, the governing board, administrators, faculty, staff, and students work together for the good of the institution.

C. Governing Board . . .

7. The governing board acts in a manner consistent with its policies and bylaws....

11. The governing board upholds a code of ethics and conflict of interest policy, and individual board members adhere to the code. The board has a clearly defined policy for dealing with behavior that violates its code and implements it when necessary.

Board Policy:

BP 2715 states "The Board of Trustees will promptly address any violation by a member or members of the Board of its Code of Ethics/Standards of Conduct and/or Board policies which are the responsibility of individual members, including, but not limited to, ... BP 2715 titled Code of Ethics

Such violations will be addressed by the Board President, who will first discuss the violation(s) with the Board member in an effort to seek to reach a resolution. If resolution is not achieved and further action is deemed necessary by the Board President, the Board President may appoint an ad hoc committee composed of up to three Board members to examine the matter and recommend further courses of action to the Board."

Evidence:

- 1. Correspondence from Jonathan Abboud, Board President to Veronica Gallardo dated June 30, 2023 re request to meet and discuss repeated violations of Board Policy and Accreditation Standards.
- 2. Response from Veronica Gallardo dated
- 3. Previous emails from Board President Jonathan Abboud to Trustee Gallardo.

- 4. Previous email from Kate Parker to Veronica Gallardo with request to meet regarding Gallardo's violations of BP 2715. In an interview by the Ad Hoc Committee former Trustee Parker stated that this request to meet was ignored by Trustee Gallardo, and additional requests to meet were ignored throughout her term as President.
- 5. Trustee Gallardo did meet with then Board President Peter Haslund and Dr. Murillo on December 1, 2021, near the end of his term as President, but no resolution was reached.

Hi, Veronica,

Wow, this chain is upsetting. You're crossing the line by making demands of Kindred as an individual board member, by stepping into administrative responsibilities, and by repeatedly emailing her on the same issue when you've already received a response. I know you would never intentionally be unkind and disrespectful to anyone, so I'm surprised and saddened at how you're interacting with the Superintendent/President.

Since I've seen this unfortunate conduct multiple times over the past year, I'll remind you now of the Board's Code of Ethics/Standards of Conduct (BP 2715) and the procedures that are in place for getting back on track. Your interactions with Kindred violate the policy, beginning with "The Board expects its members to work collegially with each other and the Superintendent/President" and continuing through points outlining that authority rests with the Board *as a whole* in its legally constituted meetings, the distinction between Board and staff roles, and the expectation that we will maintain respectful communication. Under BP 2715, violations are first to be addressed by the board president. To that end, let's you and I talk this through. When can you meet online or in person?

BP 2715 states "

Standards of Conduct

To maximize Board effectiveness and institutional and public confidence in District governance, individual Board members are expected to govern responsibly and hold themselves to the highest standards of ethical conduct. The Board expects its members to work collegially with each other and the Superintendent/President to ensure that decisions are made which are in the best interests of students and the District.

Each member of the Board of Trustees will:

Demonstrate effective leadership by

- personally complying with all of his/her duties and responsibilities under BP 2200 titled Board Duties and Responsibilities and conducting himself/herself in accordance with these standards of conduct.
- . . .

-attending and participating in all meetings, insofar as possible, having prepared for discussion and decision by reviewing all agenda materials.

Evidence:

Between July 8, 2021 and July 6, 2023 Trustee Veronica Gallardo was absent from 19 Board Meetings and arrived late or left early from an additional 14 Board meetings or Board subcommittee meetings, totaling 33 (52%) of 62 meetings. The meetings that Trustee Gallardo missed included all of the closed session Board interview and discussion meetings leading to the selection of Interim Superintendent/President Kindred Murillo on August 5, 12, 18 and 20, 2021, and she also missed the initial closed session Board interviews of two candidates for Superintendent/ President on March 18, 2023 and was very late for deliberations on March 19, 2023. Dr. Murillo's contract was initially for September 7, 2021 to September 6, 2022 and later extended for an additional year.

Selection of a Superintendent/President for the college is one of the most important responsibilities of the Board of Trustees. In addition, Trustee Gallardo's frequent absences from Board meetings and corresponding failure to vote deprived the Board of her perspective on the issues before the Board and the opportunity to interact with the Board as it conducts the business of the college and discusses a wide variety of important matters including the annual budget.

Trustee Gallardo was absent all or part of at least the following Board or Sub-Committee meetings: July 8, 2021, July 12, 2021, July 14, 2021, August 5, 2021, August 12, 2021, August 18, 2021, August 20, 2021, August 26, 2021, September 9, 2021 (Special Meeting with missing vote on final budget), September 23, 2021, October 28, 2021, November 18, 2021 (Special Meeting) and November 18, 2021 (Regular Meeting), January 20, 2022, February 3, 2022, February 10, 2022, February 17, 2022, March 3, 2022, April 20, 2022, July 7, 2022, February, 2, 2023, February 16, 2023, March 2, 2023, March 9, 2023, March 18, 2023, March 19, 2023, March 23, 2023, March 30, 2023 (two meetings), May 15, 2023, June 8, 2023, June 15, 2023, and July 6, 2023.

During Board zoom meetings held during the pandemic that she did attend, Trustee Gallardo was frequently off video or even a substitute picture unless she was speaking further minimizing her participation with the Board and the public.

Thank you Cindy for your time and energy facilitating yesterday's afternoon retreat.

Marsha brought up the issue of the retreat not being recorded. Here are my thoughts:

- For the last 10 years, the board has always met to conduct the public's business in front of the public. The public does not
 have access to what was discussed at yesterday's Special Meeting, Board Retreat via audio or video recording as has been
 the case for the last 10 years. Kindred's notes do not replace our practice and what the community has come to expect from
 the board when we meet.
- Comments were made at yesterday's board retreat by one or more members of the board, about previous employees, who
 were not present at our meeting, and do not have an opportunity to hear what was said about them, because it was not
 recorded, and therefore will not be able to offer their point of view.
- With regard to item 3.1 public comment, Instructions for Addressing the Board, we did not have the board's executive
 assistant present for the public to follow what was noticed on the agenda. I realize we did not have public comment, however
 the directions were noticed and we should have been prepared to follow through if needed.
- Finally, item 2.2 Pledge of Allegiance, this item was skipped until I brought it up. We should follow our agenda even when the
 public isn't present to witness what the board is doing.

Because of what I described in the first two bullet points, I will recuse myself from attending the second half of today's retreat.

Evidence:

Trustee Gallardo unilaterally and repeatedly ordered Dr. Murillo to take specific actions, attempting to control operational matters beyond the scope of her role as trustee. (See attached emails.). She did not bring these matters before the Board as a whole or inquire of the Board President but simply attempted to direct the Superintendent/President by herself. When the Board President became aware of her inappropriate direction to Dr. Murillo, the Board President admonished her to cease, but this did not change her behavior, and as noted elsewhere, Trustee Gallardo declined to meet to resolve the issues.

The directions Trustee Gallardo attempted to give Dr. Murillo included a verbal direction to Dr. Murillo to "fire" or "take care of" four employees of the college for speaking at a meeting of the Board of the Carpinteria Unified School District regarding Trustee Gallardo's employment a a principal within the Carpinteria District (unrelated to the SBCC District) and posting comments on social media before the meeting. In response Dr. Murillo consulted two attorneys from different law firms with specialized expertise in the laws applicable to community colleges who both advised her that the employees were exercising their rights to free speech, there was no evidence they were acting on college time or attempting to speak on behalf of the college and so there was no basis for any action at all on the part of the District. Dr. Murillo explained this to Trustee Gallardo in an email. Subsequently Trustee Gallardo complained to Dr Cindy Miles and Dr. Benjamin, who were working as consultants to SBCC, that she had made this same complaint to Dr. Murillo and that Dr. Murillo had "done nothing' about her complaint. This was untrue.

Trustee Gallardo attempted to direct Dr. Murillo to include her preferred local organization for medical advice regarding unexpected pregnancy and sexual health needs on the college's website list of providers. This is a decision that Dr. Murillo delegates to staff at the college's wellness center and the supervisor of Student Services and it is not appropriate for a trustee, (or even the entire Board) to attempt to override such decisions.

Trustee Gallardo also attempted to unilaterally direct Dr. Murillo on the specific implementation of Resolution 1 adopted by a Board majority and governing vaccination and masking requirements during the pandemic.

Hi Kindred,

I heard Trustee Guilap-Moore request at the end of the last board meeting that she was interested in having SBCC increase the sexual and reproductive health services for our students. If I may, I wanted to pass along some information of what we have done in the recent past and what we are currently doing this spring both in The WELL and in The Clinic side of Student Health Services in the areas of sexual and reproductive health.

Clinically, Student Health Services offers pregnancy testing, emergency contraception and condoms in house. However, beginning next month the SB Neighborhood Clinics will be returning to SBCC weekly (this stopped due to COVID) to provide expanded sexaul health services which will add birth control options, STI (sexually transmitted infections) testing and treatment, and emergency contraception ("Plan B") for patients. Student Health Services also participates in the FamPact Program for sexual health services so that students can be referred to SB Neighborhood Clinics and Planned Parenthood (other organizations that participate in the FamPact Program) for little to no cost.

Finally, <u>The WELL</u> provides a host of workshops (some in partnership with Planned Parenthood and other organizations) that include STI information, Healthy Relationships, Birth Control Methods, Sex Trafficking Awareness, etc.

Both centers also provide free menstrual hygiene packets for students and we are currently working with Facilities and Operations to install free dispensers in key bathrooms on campus and increase signage in all bathrooms.

And again, attached please find some of the work that has been done in this area over the past few semesters.

I hope this helps. Please let me know if I can provide any additional information. Paloma

You missed nothing. We also follow all the current information in the state. We are currently revising our five year projections. At the start of this budget year we had \$5 million in budgeted unfilled positions. We can't hire fast enough right now to fill the vacancies we have to serve students.

We are not planning a reduction in force at this time and I would not imagine in the near future as we are looking at probably between a million to two million in budget savings this year in unfilled positions. We also have \$36 million (36%) in reserves, I would recommend spending some of that down before implementing any kind of reduction in force.

> I have attached a map with a preliminary sketched boundary of the carve out we are hoping to achieve. This will address the City's outstanding need to provide adequate storage space close to the harbor for fisheries per the Coastal Act. The space would be used for trailered fishing vessels (all small boats), and a few shipping containers for gear storage. We would negotiate an annual rent and lease terms that meet the needs of SBCC.

> We have been working closely with city and county leaders for more than 5 years to find a site to solve this problem. Rebecca Bjork has asked us to approach the Board of Trustees directly about finding support to use a small portion of Lot #3.

> The carve out would take up about ~12% of the ~150 parking spaces in the lot - ones at the farthest end that are probably less used. Note that the area at the tip of the triangle looks in the photo to be unpaved, but to our knowledge, it is soil and debris dumped over pavement that could perhaps be removed to create more usable space.

> The CC has \$700 million in new grant funding and has told us this type of project is completely eligible for funding. Our plan would be to use Coastal Conservancy grant funds to cover the cost of prepping the site, working out the legal agreements that will be needed, the cost of permitting (including Coastal Commission), and beautifying the parking lot. In addition, it is possible the grant would cover or subsidize the annual rent. The grant could also wrap in additional budget for other campus needs that fall within the goals of the Coastal Conservancy (restoration and public access). The Waterfront Dept has allocated \$50K already to cover the cost of preparing a grant application.

> I can provide letters of support for this specific project from City Council, County Board of Supervisors, Salud Carbajal, Monique Limon and the Chamber of Commerce. I don't have those in hand yet, but I am highly confident of getting them quickly. I do have in hand copies of unanimous city council and county supervisor votes in favor of supporting and prioritizing finding a home for fisheries shore side space close to the harbor.

Thank you for humbly sharing your families story. Having worked with a diverse student population, including students like your daughter, I am deeply empathetic and I am aware of what you are describing with regard to sensory.

I am copying interim Superintendent President, Kindred Murillo here. I continue to recommend a policy that makes SBCC open, accessible to all, and one that supports a culture where all students feel they belong.

Until SBCC moves in the direction of our neighboring sister colleges who have already opened their campuses to all students, I want to explore what we can do now to ensure your daughter is provided the differentiated supports she needs to fully access the SBCC Mission.

At the K-12 level we worked through this mask issue and I imagine we can do the same at SBCC for your daughter.

No student in our community should be experiencing the isolation you are describing. Please let us know what support we can offer now, until SBCC removes the vaccine and mask mandate.

On a final note, the college no longer requires students to be tested. I clarified this with Kindred at a board meeting a few weeks ago. Kindred confirmed all parents had to do to enroll their student was get the vaccine exemption and wear a mask. In your case there is something we should be able to do with regard to the mask. I have noticed the SBCC website is not up to date with regard to testing no longer being required. I communicated that to Kindred and she has asked for it to be updated.

Dear Ms. Gallardo,

I am writing in regards to the Covid 19 vaccine requirement, testing, and masking mandates that still remain in effect at Santa Barbara City College. These requirements are inherently unfair and discriminatory to unvaccinated students.

My daughter is currently a student at SBCC. She has autism and is a DSPS student. Because of her autism, she takes a reduced course load. My daughter has also had Covid and, therefore, has natural immunity. Because my daughter has autism, she processes sensory information differently. Mask wearing is extremely difficult for her. Because of SBCC's Covid policies, my daughter has not been able to attend in person classes now for almost 3 entire calendar years. She has been cheated out of a robust educational experience. Before Covid, going to in person class at SBCC was her main source of interaction with other people. Now, she is home, isolated, alone, taking online classes by herself.

The entire premise of the Covid 19 vaccine was that it "would stop the spread." We now know that the Covid 19 vaccine does not prevent infection and vaccinated individuals can indeed catch Covid and spread Covid. Moreover, the CDC itself has acknowledged that myocarditis and pericarditis are known side effects from the Covid 19 vaccines, particularly for adolescents and young adult males, age 16 and older.

In January of 2022, the CDC acknowledged that surviving Covid provides excellent

natural immunity. The August 11, 2022 guidance from the CDC indicates that Covid 19 prevention recommendations no longer make a differentiation based on a person's vaccination status. Per the CDD, due to breakthrough infections and naturally acquired immunity, there is no reason to treat vaccinated and unvaccinated individuals differently.

Allan Hancock College in Santa Maria removed their Covid vaccine and testing mandate on May 31, 2022. At Hancock, masking is not required. In October of 2021, the Ventura County Community College District lifted their vaccine mandate and allowed students to choose between vaccination or testing. On August 10, 2022, the Ventura County Community College District board lifted their vaccine mandate entirely. At Ventura College, unvaccinated students are no longer required to test and masking is not required.

SBCC cannot truly be a community college for the entire community so long as these discriminatory Covid policies remain in place. I suspect that SBCC's problem with declining enrollment has a lot to do with SBCC's Covid policies. We are in a very different place than we were a year ago. It is time that SBCC adjusts to this new reality just as Allan Hancock and Ventura Colleges did. I respectfully request that SBCC update their Covid policy to follow the new CDC guidance and remove their Covid vaccine and masking requirements.

Dear Mrs. Gallardo,

My son graduated from San Marcos High in 2020. He has been attending SBCC full-time since then and is transferring to the University of Arizona (U of A) this fall with straight A's. Due to the Covid vaccine mandates all of his classes have been on-line and all but two have been asynchronous.

In meeting with his academic advisor at U of A he was informed that his math classes would not transfer because the exams were not proctored. For this reason alone, on-line classes are not equivalent to in-person classes. Combine that with asynchronous, classes offering zero interaction with instructors and other students, and you get an inferior and unequal education. My son hopes to minor in American Sign Language (ASL) and is required to test into ASL classes at U of A. We have a family friend who is deaf and used to teach ASL. Our friend was shocked at how little my son was able to converse after receiving A's for three semesters of on-line, asynchronous ASL at SBCC.

Not only was it hurtful and unfair that he was not allowed on campus with his friends and girlfriend but he let go of his long time dream and changed his major due to three classes he needed that were only offered in person. Now he is shocked that the math classes he worked so hard at will not count and he is deficient in ASL. This will impact his timing and finances. He will need an additional semester to graduate and must pay out of state tuition for these classes he thought were completed.

I wanted to make you aware of this additional way SBCC's irrational and unscientific vaccine policy is discriminating against students while providing no public health benefit. My son is a low income Latino student who has worked very hard to achieve academic success. He is paying for his own college and although we are grateful for The Promise and the free education he has received at SBCC, it was a shock to find out after the fact, that his math classes wouldn't count because the exams were not proctored.

I would agree with Dr. Murillo. You are overstepping clear Trustee boundaries. A college President can't do her job if Trustees interfere by asking staff to take specific actions. There are good reasons for this threshold. First, you may be the only Trustee interested in these data, in which case your request is both time-consuming and unproductive. Second, it undermines the authority of our CEO, a job for which she was hired. Finally, this college is undergoing an accreditation visit, and your actions could easily be interpreted as a basic violation of ACCJC standards that could justify sanctions.

Though you and I may disagree on policy from time to time, I have a great deal of respect for both your perspective and your courage in putting forth that perspective, but none of us can be allowed to interfere in the business of the college. We have hired the CEO. That's our job. From everything I hear about the stresses of campus life as we transition back to a face-to-face college, all is going relatively smoothly, and this is largely attributed to the careful work of Dr. Murillo. If we assumed that this transition would be as simple as switching on the lights, we would be dead wrong. It will be accomplished in a step-by-step process, taking very careful account of the legitimate concerns of our community (faculty, students, staff, and administration) for their personal safety.

For another few months, I will serve as the Board President. Though each of us is free to communicate directly with our CEO, it is often better to have a conversation with the Board President first for the purpose of gaining feedback about the issue. This is not required, but it is in keeping with our generally accepted process of acting as one board.

How are students going to access the library & student services? There are two modalities to access library and student services - F2F and Online. If a student wishes to access F2F they will need to comply with the vaccine mandate. We have worked hard to help and accommodate student needs.

The community is concerned that we are nearing 90% in salaries & benefits & yet students can't access critical wrap around services etc.

Services are provided at the college sites. As I walked around the site, students were using those services in various areas. While I am working on trying to up the hours of services, my observation is we are still not seeing as many students as we have services.

How many student services folks including, library, & tutoring are on campus serving students? Staff will provide me these figures. I don't have these yet.

Can we disaggregate this data? We are a Hispanic Serving institution, what's the number of students that can no longer access a critical service inside an SBCC building? And no, the community is not sold on this idea that all can be done on-line. If so, are we looking at a reduction in workforce and moving toward serving students through smart technology?

May I ask who makes up the term community? Since I have arrived I have three community members contact me. My mobile phone number is all over the place, I try to respond to every inquiry I receive. Students are finding their way to me.

As we try to project the future of what students want, need, and will help them succeed, we will be looking at rightsizing the college and reorganizing to serve students in all the modalities they want and need. These will be face-to-face; online; and hybrid. Some students are loving the remote counseling services because they are more convenient. As we move out of COVID, we are creating a task force to consider these questions and thoughtfully answer them. We should have results of our student survey in the next week, and we are starting a student reengagement effort which will give us some more personal data. Most data I can have disaggregated except for some of the COVID data.

In my opinion, we do not do a good enough job of outreach to our Hispanic population and that is changing. I believe we should have a Puente Program here and other specific outreach to not only our high school population and we need to do more for our non traditional students who work in our community and want and deserve upward mobility. We just received a \$3.5 million HSI grant and I intend to ensure SBCC uses it to benefit our Hispanic populations.

I worked a table this week where we had lines or students. There are students at the college. The fall is 25-31% in-person and spring is starting to look much more like it will be between 45 and 50%.

Dr. Scott is working on an enrollment management strategy and important courses students need will be part of that plan. We are engaged in the Strong Workforce Program which helps us gage what occupations to support in our local community.

Wow, this chain is upsetting. You're crossing the line by making demands of Kindred as an individual board member, by stepping into administrative responsibilities, and by repeatedly emailing her on the same issue when you've already received a response. Good Morning Board of Trustees,

There are about 14 college employees including two Trustees at CCLC and I am really happy we have a large group here. I am excited that college leaders are taking building capacity very seriously this year so I believe the reserves you gave us for professional learning are well spent.

I have been doing some research and had a discussion with Brian Fahnestock who used to work at SBCC and is currently at UC Irvine as the interim CBO. See attached resume.

He wants to come back and work in Santa Barbara, and I am liking what I am seeing in his work and professional experience. We currently pay \$187,087 for our VP's and he would need to make \$200,000 k to get him to leave his current job. The 12,913 that is the difference would easily be made up in savings since I would not have to pay for his expenses as he already lives here.

It is hard to rent anything furnished in Santa Barbara that is decent for less than \$300 per day which is \$9,300 per month. So even if I gave a \$4,000 housing allowance I am still paying out \$48,000 for housing someone for a year.

Bottom line is it would be less expensive to negotiate a \$200,000 salary with Brian than it would be to pay another person's salary plus expenses.

I would like to offer him an interim 8 month contract from January 1, 2023 to August 31, 2022 for the Interim CBO. This will give the new president a chance to hire their own CBO as I can start the recruitment in May and have candidates ready for them to consider by late July.

I wanted to let you know this is what I am thinking before I move into negotiations with him just in case there are some issues I am unaware of which there usually are.

Please let me know if you have issues with what I am thinking.

Hi Veronica,

Ben and I so enjoyed chatting with you and Juan at Lindsay's party on Saturday!

I have attached a map with a preliminary sketched boundary of the carve out we are hoping to achieve. This will address the City's outstanding need to provide adequate storage space close to the harbor for fisheries per the Coastal Act. The space would be used for trailered fishing vessels (all small boats), and a few shipping containers for gear storage. We would negotiate an annual rent and lease terms that meet the needs of SBCC.

We have been working closely with city and county leaders for more than 5 years to find a site to solve this problem. Rebecca Bjork has asked us to approach the Board of Trustees directly about finding support to use a small portion of Lot #3.

I can send you a formal proposal to share with the board, but in a nutshell ...

The carve out would take up about ~12% of the ~150 parking spaces in the lot - ones at the farthest end that are probably less used. Note that the area at the tip of the triangle looks in the photo to be unpaved, but to our knowledge, it is soil and debris dumped over pavement that could perhaps be removed to create more usable space.

The CC has \$700 million in new grant funding and has told us this type of project is completely eligible for funding. Our plan would be to use Coastal Conservancy grant funds to cover the cost of prepping the site, working out the legal agreements that will be needed, the cost of permitting (including Coastal Commission), and beautifying the parking lot. In addition, it is possible the grant would cover or subsidize the annual rent. The grant could also wrap in additional budget for other campus needs that fall within the goals of the Coastal Conservancy (restoration and public access). The Waterfront Dept has allocated \$50K already to cover the cost of preparing a grant application.

I can provide letters of support for this specific project from City Council, County Board of Supervisors, Salud Carbajal, Monique Limon and the Chamber of Commerce. I don't have those in hand yet, but I am highly confident of getting them quickly. I do have in hand copies of unanimous city council and county supervisor votes in favor of supporting and prioritizing finding a home for fisheries shore side space close to the harbor.

Looking forward to discussing this further with the Trustees!

Dear Mrs. Gallardo,

My son graduated from San Marcos High in 2020. He has been attending SBCC full-time since then and is transferring to the University of Arizona (U of A) this fall with straight A's. Due to the Covid vaccine mandates all of his classes have been on-line and all but two have been asynchronous.

In meeting with his academic advisor at U of A he was informed that his math classes would not transfer because the exams were not proctored. For this reason alone, on-line classes are not equivalent to in-person classes. Combine that with asynchronous, classes offering zero interaction with instructors and other students, and you get an inferior and unequal education. My son hopes to minor in American Sign Language (ASL) and is required to test into ASL classes at U of A. We have a family friend who is deaf and used to teach ASL. Our friend was shocked at how little my son was able to converse after receiving A's for three semesters of on-line, asynchronous ASL at SBCC.

Not only was it hurtful and unfair that he was not allowed on campus with his friends and girlfriend but he let go of his long time dream and changed his major due to three classes he needed that were only offered in person. Now he is shocked that the math classes he worked so hard at will not count and he is deficient in ASL. This will impact his timing and finances. He will need an additional semester to graduate and must pay out of state tuition for these classes he thought were completed.

I wanted to make you aware of this additional way SBCC's irrational and unscientific vaccine policy is discriminating against students while providing no public health benefit. My son is a low income Latino student who has worked very hard to achieve academic success. He is paying for his own college and although we are grateful for The Promise and the free education he has received at SBCC, it was a shock to find out after the fact, that his math classes wouldn't count because the exams were not proctored.

I have requested current data for fall semester on vaccination rates at SBCC, a table previously labeled "vaccination summary" that was part of the monthly COVID report that we last saw in February. I have attached the document. Additionally, I have requested that a current report be included on the agenda for the Board of Trustees meeting.

I hope you and the other Trustees are curious about these figures for fall 2022 as well, and can bring them to light. This important data, reflecting the impact of policies, can be used to make informed decisions

It was mentioned at several BOT meetings that we don't have data that shows how many students are not attending SBCC due to the mandate. I applaud their community outreach and efforts to quantify impact of their vaccination policy in the community, it demonstrates their caring and I think is a good example for SBCC.

Good Morning Board President Abboud and Vice President Everett,

Late last March, March Trustee Gallardo called me and told me I needed to fire or "take care of" employees who she believes were involved in an unsavory situation that Trustee Gallardo was involved in at Carpinteria USD which ultimately led to either her resignation or removal (I don't know what ultimately happened). The employees were Ana Garcia, part-time counselor; Chelsea Lancaster, EOPS classified employee; and she said she wasn't sure the name of the faculty member who posted on social media and would get me the information. It later turned out to be Margaret Prothero, faculty and later she sent me a video of Craig Cook, faculty.

After that I conferred with the college counsel Craig Price and also had a second opinion from Trevin Sims, an attorney who I have worked with in the past who has advised me well.

I reviewed the information she sent me and noted to her in a phone call that I could not find any evidence these employees were using their positions at SBCC or that they made their posts during work hours. I followed up with the email below.

Following is the email I sent to her after conferring with the Board president and Craig for the last time.

Later she sent me a text with a video from CUSD and accused Craig Cook of representing SBCC at the Board meeting.

I told her I would look into it and I did review the CUSD board meetings and found that Craig Cook said he was a "faculty member from SBCC"; and did not say he represented SBCC. I advised her of that.

I was recently made aware that she is telling people that there is a big lawsuit coming and that I did nothing to follow up on her complaint regarding SBCC employees. I want to be clear she directed me to fire or "take care" of these employees which was inappropriate for a board member. I looked into it by spending hours going through CUSD board meetings and found no reason to open an investigation. I handled it with graciousness and care not to cause her any more stress that I felt she must be going through, and to keep things calm at SBCC. I am starting to regret that decision.

The reason I am sending this to you is I wanted this all documented. I want this hiring to go well, and for nothing to explode in this process. I just want you to have the documentation if anything comes up.

Thank you both for having the courage to move this board to a better place. You are both trying to create a good environment for the new president and the college. I really appreciate that and I hope Trustee Gallardo will like the next president and not have to endure what I have dealt with for the last 18 months.

I am coing Craig on this and my plan is to do everything I can to help keep things calm through the rest of this hiring and until my contract ends. I truly respect the majority of the board and have confidence you will get someone who can move this college forward.

Gallardo's communications to and about the Superintendent/President have been disrespectful on several occasions over email, in public meetings, and in closed sessions.

Authorities

Violations of Accreditation Standards threaten the accreditation of the entire college. Loss of accreditation effectively closes the college for all students because it results in the loss of financial aid for students at the college and renders all courses and degrees ineligible for credit at other institutions of higher learning.

Thank you Kindred, yes this is a cleaner version to view. What's the plan? 55% for students is concerning, I think you'd agree...

How are students going to access the library & student services? There are two modalities to access library and student services - F2F and Online. If a student wishes to access F2F they will need to comply with the vaccine mandate. We have worked hard to help and accommodate student needs.

The community is concerned that we are nearing 90% in salaries & benefits & yet students can't access critical wrap around services etc.

Services are provided at the college sites. As I walked around the site, students were using those services in various areas. While I am working on trying to up the hours of services, my observation is we are still not seeing as many students as we have services.

How many student services folks including, library, & tutoring are on campus serving students? Staff will provide me these figures. I don't have these yet.

Can we disaggregate this data? We are a Hispanic Serving institution, what's the number of students that can no longer access a critical service inside an SBCC building? And no, the community is not sold on this idea that all can be done on-line. If so, are we looking at a reduction in workforce and moving toward serving students through smart technology?

May I ask who makes up the term community? Since I have arrived I have three community members contact me. My mobile phone number is all over the place, I try to respond to every inquiry I receive. Students are finding their way to me.

As we try to project the future of what students want, need, and will help them succeed, we will be looking at rightsizing the college and reorganizing to serve students in all the modalities they want and need. These will be face-to-face; online; and hybrid. Some students are loving the remote counseling services because they are more convenient. As we move out of COVID, we are creating a task force to consider these questions and thoughtfully answer them. We should have results of our student survey in the next week, and we are starting a student reengagement effort which will give us some more personal data. Most data I can have disaggregated except for some of the COVID data.

In my opinion, we do not do a good enough job of outreach to our Hispanic population and that is changing. I believe we should have a Puente Program here and other specific outreach to not only our high school population and we need to do more for our non traditional students who work in our community and want and deserve upward mobility. We just received a \$3.5 million HSI grant and I intend to ensure SBCC uses it to benefit our Hispanic populations.

Kindred, you can imagine how troubling this is.

Pictures were floating around this week of an empty SBCC campus & the community is wondering what is going on, where are the students, where are the employees? There are times and spaces where you won't see a lot of students. As I walk about the SB site I witness classroom doors open with teachers instructing classes. We have a several outdoor classes. If the "community" walks over the Student Life, and the cafeteria there are plenty of students. Not sure when the "community" are at the sites. I worked a table this week where we had lines or students. There are students at the college. The fall is 25-31% in-person and spring is starting to look much more like it will be between 45 and 50%.

Adult high school is another percentage point that is beyond concerning, what's the plan there? These students need a GED, ESL courses, the conditions created under this mandate do not align with the values of SBCC. This is not who we are as a community. Students need to access in person services & classes. I know many of these students by name, and they are not just a number or a percentage. We continue to work on accomodating student needs. Dr. Scott, I, the Academic Senate President, and the Faculty Association President are working with our department chairs and faculty to ensure GED and IGETC are in all modalities. Carola Smith does an awesome job of ensuring ESL courses are in appropriate modalities.

As one example, you probably know K-12 districts are having a difficult time hiring, in person evening & weekend ECE classes would really make an impact to education right now. Dr. Scott is working on an enrollment management strategy and important courses students need will be part of that plan. We are engaged in the Strong Workforce Program which helps us gage what occupations to support in our local community.

Have you given any thought to what Allan Hancock is doing, providing an exemption for deeply held beliefs, weekly testing options, removing the N95 mask, & instead adding a regular face mask, opening the campus for the students to use the facilities & attend their classes from SBCC. I only have so much authority under the vaccine mandate resolution. I exercise it carefully, within the parameters the Board of Trustees gave me. I give a lot of thought to every option and what works at one college doesn't always work well at another.

What is the plan to revisit this and provide the community with the all inclusive & accessible education SBCC once offered? I am doing what the Board has asked me to do. I take my instructions from the board as a whole, if the Board wishes to change directions, I am open to that. As much as I try to hear what every Board member says and represents, I learned a long time ago, I work for the board as a whole. I try to give good advice and recommendations, and am hired to ensure the college operates within the statutes of the State of California and adheres to Board policies and procedures.

Please provide us with answers to these questions.

Are you available this week to start meeting with the community? We have many beautiful outdoor spaces in Santa Barbara, and you can leave the college to go out and meet people. I have sat on this all week and not responded. In fact I have not responded to several of Trustee Gallardo's emails this week, so I want you aware of that. The email below is unprofessional as I am doing exactly what the Board of Trustees asked me to do. She has missed so many closed sessions that she has no idea the conversations.

Please consider this notification, I am filing a complaint against Trustee Gallard for violation of BP 2715 and BP 3050. Trustee Gallardo went too far in the last Board meeting both in closed session and open session with her disrespectful behavior toward me.

I would quietly go away in September except for I believe if I don't speak up that I am teaching people to just put up with a bully, and that is not who I am as a leader. And I am just reinforcing her bad behavior which I do not wish on the incoming leader. I have excused her since I came because for a long time I felt she was taking out her anger at the Board for getting rid of Goswami on me, and I felt sorry for her because of the situation in Carpinteria. Late last March, March Trustee Gallardo called me and told me I needed to fire or "take care of" employees who she believes were involved in an unsavory situation that Trustee Gallardo was involved in at Carpinteria USD which ultimately led to either her resignation or removal (I don't know what ultimately happened). The employees were Ana Garcia, part-time counselor; Chelsea Lancaster, EOPS classified employee; and she said she wasn't sure the name of the faculty member who posted on social media and would get me the information. It later turned out to be Margaret Prothero, faculty and later she sent me a video of Craig Cook, faculty.

After that I conferred with the college counsel Craig Price and also had a second opinion from Trevin Sims, an attorney who I have worked with in the past who has advised me well.

I reviewed the information she sent me and noted to her in a phone call that I could not find any evidence these employees were using their positions at SBCC or that they made their posts during work hours. I followed up with the email below.

Following is the email I sent to her after conferring with the Board president and Craig for the last time.

Later she sent me a text with a video from CUSD and accused Craig Cook of representing SBCC at the Board meeting.

I told her I would look into it and I did review the CHSD hoard meetings and found that Crain Cook said he was a "faculty member from SBCC". CD 69 and did not say he represented SBCC. I advised her of that.

I was recently made aware that she is telling people that there is a big lawsuit coming and that I did nothing to follow up on her complaint regarding SBCC employees. I want to be clear she directed me to fire or "take care" of these employees which was inappropriate for a board member. I looked into it by spending hours going through CUSD board meetings and found no reason to open an investigation. I handled it with graciousness and care not to cause her any more stress that I felt she must be going through, and to keep things calm at SBCC. I am starting to regret that decision.

The reason I am sending this to you is I wanted this all documented. I want this hiring to go well, and for nothing to explode in this process. I just want you to have the documentation if anything comes up.

Thank you both for having the courage to move this board to a better place. You are both trying to create a good environment for the new president and the college. I really appreciate that and I hope Trustee Gallardo will like the next president and not have to endure what I have dealt with for the last 18 months.

I am ccing Craig on this and my plan is to do everything I can to help keep things calm through the rest of this hiring and until my contract ends. I truly respect the majority of the board and have confidence you will get someone who can move this college forward.

Thank you for having trust in me to share what you have been experiencing. This must be a very difficult period for you, and I want to do whatever I can to support you in your Board role.

I want to make sure and follow up on the concerns you brought to my attention regarding college employees and their outside activities. I checked with the College Counsel, Craig Price and Trevin Sims, Lozano Smith, who is doing some work for us. Both confirmed for me that the postings you provided me appear to be protected free speech under the First Amendment.

Unless you want to raise your concerns to the level of a complaint in which you document all your concerns, I can't give you a definitive answer as to whether any college policies could potentially be implicated. Please refer to Administrative Policy 3435

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Exhibit E Statement of Authorities and Evidence

V. Violation of BP 2200, and BP 2715 and Accreditation Standards IV. C. 2 and 7. Trustee Gallardo has failed to uphold the principle, in BP 2200 and BP 2715 and ACCJC Standard IV C 2, that once the Board of Trustees has taken action on a decision it moves forward as a whole. Trustee Gallardo had ample opportunity to provide comments, and did provide her comments, when the topic of a COVID-19 vaccine mandate was on the Board agenda. However, after a vaccine mandate was adopted by a majority of the Board on August 5, 2021, Trustee Gallardo did not accept that the matter had been discussed and decided by the Board and repeatedly reargued her opposition to the vaccine mandate and related health requirements during agenda items not on that topic. Trustee Gallardo failed to adhere to BP 2340 to work with the Board President and Superintendent to place on the agenda an item that allows for the constructive communication of her differing viewpoint.

Authorities

Violations of Accreditation Standards threaten the accreditation of the entire college. Loss of accreditation effectively closes the college for all students because it results in the loss of financial aid for students at the college and renders all courses and degrees ineligible for credit at other institutions of higher learning.

Accreditation Standards: (June 2014, currently applicable)

"Introduction

The primary purpose of an ACCJC-accredited institution is to foster student learning and student achievement. ... There are four Standards that work together to define and promote student success, academic quality, institutional integrity, and excellence....

Standard IV: Leadership and Governance

...Governance roles are defined in policy and are designed to facilitate decisions that support student learning programs and services and improve institutional effectiveness, while acknowledging the designated responsibilities of the governing board and the chief executive officer. Through established governance structures, processes, and practices, the governing board, administrators, faculty, staff, and students work together for the good of the institution.

C. Governing Board . . .

2. The governing board acts as a collective entity. Once the board reaches a decision, all board members act in support of the decision. ...

7. The governing board acts in a manner consistent with its policies and bylaws.

Board Policy:

- refraining from lengthy repetitive commentaries during Board meetings.
- Recognizing what a matter has been adequately considered by the entire Board and refraining from repeatedly revisiting an issue or matter that is a personal interest or concern not shared by the Board as a whole.

The Board recognizes the rights of individual Board members to freely express their views and encourages open, informed and thorough discussion of issues before the Board. The Board believes that effective Board members have a responsibility to respectfully express themselves during discussions before Board decisions, whether in agreement or disagreement with the Board majority, in ways that promote the Board's ability to govern the District. However, once the Board has reached a decision on a matter, then the Board acts as a whole and it is the responsibility of every Board member to accept and support the decision that the Board as a whole has reached."

Evidence:

On May 27, 2021 a majority of the Board of Trustees adopted a motion urging that all students and employees receive COVID-19 vaccinations. Trustee Gallardo was present and expressed her views. On August 5, 2021 a majority of the Board voted to to adopt a different Resolution that required (with limited conditional exemptions) students and employees who worked or attended classes in person to be vaccinated, and to comply with required related health and safety measures effective October 2, 2021 or upon FDA approval of a vaccine. The Board received numerous emails and heard and considered extensive public comment both for and against the resolution. Trustee Gallardo was late for the August 5, 2021 meeting but was present for the public comments and the discussion of Resolution 1. She expressed her views against Resolution 1 at length before the Board voted.

Thereafter Trustee Gallardo repeatedly brought up her opposition to the vaccine mandate at length in Board and Sub-Committee meetings regardless of whether it was relevant to the agenda item under consideration. This was disruptive to Board meetings and distracted from a focus on the agenda item before the Board.

The video references and transcriptions below from Board meetings incorporated by reference herein.

October 23, 2021 Board Retreat.

Agenda Item 4.1 Part One – How we communicate with each other, our constituencies, and community under pandemic conditions.

49:47 VERONICA: "Kindred, you had said -correct me if I'm wrong. The Garvin Theatre is excluded from the mandate?"

49:53 KINDRED: "Not excluded. The way we've set it up for the Garvin Theatre is you have to produce a vaccine card or a test that is negative over the last 72 hours. And so I think that is a way of handling this except for the issue of making sure that we don't pack the boardroom so that we're taking care of the safety issues."

50:26 VERONICA: "So that was a creative solution that you thought of Kindred. And so that might be like for Santa Barbara High School when the children graduated they had Covid tests available for the parents. So maybe we just have the quick 15 minute available for the public if they don't have one already. And they just go right in."

(Kindred comments).

50:56 VERONICA: "Or the public can just provide evidence on their own." (Kindred comments)

51:08. VERONICA: "So I think that is what we are hearing. The college is made up of people and absent the people you don't have a college."

51:45. VERONICA: "Yeah, I do thing that there's roadblocks. And a lot of them have been created by people. Some of them are created by circumstances outside of our control. And I think the biggest roadblock was the vaccine mandate. And with Dr. Benjamin, who was here previously, and she's amazing, and she so candidly admitted-when I asked her, did you have a chance to talk to the community about the resolution with the mandate, and she said no. And with good reason. Her charge was the specific tasks that she had. However, I go back to the college is made up of people. And the people didn't have the opportunity to dialogue, to have these real questions, to put the inquiry question on the table, to investigate it, and to write the evidence, and to debate about it. And that's a very dangerous place to be when the perception in the community is that seven people can sit here and make a decision that's going to impact the health and well-being of the entire Santa Barbara Community College District. It's a dangerous place to be. And Santa Barbara City College, that's not in our mission. That's not in our values. And I don't think it's of anyone's fault. It's been a very emotional season. And a lot people have been able to take the emotion aside, and still think very critically about things, and have the discourse necessary. Other people have been driven by fear anxieties. And so there's a plethora in the range of things that have come up. However, having said that, it prevented folks from coming here and from us to genuinely look at them, and look at their children, and their grandchildren, and the people that need jobs, and the people that need career enhancements. So I still thank that we need to open up. And I know Kindred has saidactually, we dialoged and emailed back and forth. And I finally said to her, perhaps I step aside and let the community come speak to you. And I think that that's what you're hearing. I think you're hearing finally for the first time the community being able to come here and speak. We need have a public meeting where access is the only thing on the agenda-and let the community come and discuss just that, because the community that I've been hearing from is a community that has lost hours in sleep, time away from work. As you guys know, I get the fortunate opportunity to work with children as young as four years old, all the way up to the ages we have here at the college. And everybody is telling us, this is the community we built. It was built by the people. It was funded by the people. It belongs to the people. Don't take it away from the people."54:55 MARSHA: "Veronica, I have to disagree with your comments. We have had multiple meetings and multiple public comments on these issues. The Board does have a responsibility to make decisions. That's whey we're here. We have a made a decision. And it is your ethical obligation as a board member to support that decision. So I'm concerned that we should not be revising these issues again, and again, and again. It is not our job to keep bringing up up things that already been decided. It's our job to move forward. And I recognize these are controversial issues and that there are people who feel strongly against the decision that the board has made, but that is not unusual. It is normal for people to have differing viewpoints. And it is normal to have the discussion that we have had at multiple board meetings to cove these viewpoints. But I do not agree that we are hearing from what you are describing as the community. We are hearing from some people in the community. And actually, a relatively small part of the community. And it is their right to disagree with our decision. It is their right to come and tell us about that. And it is important that that be part of our process, but it does not require us to continually revisit issues that we have made decisions on."

56:44 VERONICA: "So I want to respond. I think you listened to what I said, but you didn't comprehend what I said. So what I said is we need an agenda item for access, because that's how we're going to engage with our community is how we provide access to our college. And that is in the full breadth of everything Santa Barbara City College offers from programs, to dual enrollment, to our School of Extended Learning, and the Career Skills Institute, athletics, you name it. So we've never in the last year have had an opportunity to dialogue with the community. As we've all said, board meeting are a on-way public comments allowed to come in. So we get a lot of receptive-it means we hear it You don't get the expressive two-way conversation. So I think there is a need for an agenda item for access to hear what access to Santa Barbara City College looks like in this agendized item that we have in terms of how we engage with the community and our constitutes. Is that clear, Kindred" Does that make sense to you?"

- Agenda item 10.1 Faculty Stipends (Veronica objections to Racial Equity Impact Assessment Project)
- 1:12:40 VERONICA: "So As I mentioned to Kindred in an email, this situation has been going on since before 2019 when grant money that is still federal tax payer money was being used on this. The question was never to question whether we should be doing anything, rather the community and myself, I agree, what it is that we are training and what is the impact? And I have asked the college to show me where is the data shows that this type of training is effective to move the needle for either black, African American, Latino students. I don't how you spend now more to the tune of almost a million dollars because Dr. Goswami gave us the latest numbers that was spent to date so Lyndsay might have it because she helped comply that information."
- 1:12:53 VERONICA: "So I don't how you keep training people to be anti racist and then you pass the most racist mandate that eliminates and kicks students out of the college, 300 students, and the fact we can just sit there and think that 300 households were just disrupted is completely disgusting and unacceptable."

Veronica Gallardo at 1:26:02 (discussing steps to get ready for a bond, PR hire) "So I mean as Kindred knows, because you you've have done a lot of these, and so there's a lot of different steps. What I'm concerned with is that we're getting ahead of ourselves, because right now we still have this mandates so as of now my my vote is no, no, no, no, no bond because of the community. No for this very issue, that we are not an open access institution and we are not inclusive of everybody. So that is in direct opposition of our mission so my concern is that you're going to spend, or we would spend all this money, and then we would go out on a bond in a six one, because I will vote no to not put this on the ballot unless we get rid of all mandates, because it is unfair, and it just does not make sense to genuinely ask someone to pay more money on their property taxes to raise our taxes for a community college that has shut the door to them, so that continues to be a real issue for me. 1:28:06 - 1:29:53 Peter Haslund returns to discussion of whether to do an RFP for a PR person or hire from a recommended group. Then he adds "I do disagree with Veronica in this sense. We, we haven't shut our campus to anybody. Anybody can come on campus. There are rules that will have to be met in order to be on campus. But we, we're not shutting our campus down . We are trying to make the campus safe for everybody else and there is no perfect way of making that judgment. I know that and I hope so does everybody else. We, we simply do the best we can with the information we have and the guidelines that are provided by the CDC. And we move forward. But it's not a closed campus, and that implication bothers me."

Veronica Gallardo at 1:31:54 - 1:34:22 "I just wanted to say that you know to Peter's comment it doesn't seem like we have, Peter, but you know, I, I'm still out in the community, I still work, I still talk to moms and dads and grandmas. And there is a lot of kids that aren't coming to campus and and the affect to their mental health is just absolutely tragic when you see a young

person whose brain isn't even fully developed yet and so much of their abilities, social registers of what they're learning it gets developed within the context of peer groups all the way up until they're 25 years old, and so there's a lot of young people that have not had access to that and that's a such direct result of Santa Barbara City College's mandates and and that's from grandmothers and mothers and aunts and neighbors. It's true it's happened. I think we did what we did with the information we had and seen as we know now that there's more information. I personally work every day since July first without taking a day off, covering many, many classrooms of many many people that were sick despite having done you know what they thought they were supposed to do, and that didn't prevent them from getting sick. And I gladly stepped up to do our biggest job as what we do. We step up to serve. But it is, it is two different points of view. Veronica Gallardo: at 30:15- 30:58 " My question is, do you know that we have a vaccine mandate on our campus? Answer: "I didn't know that offhand" Veronica Gallardo: " No. Okay, so that's the biggest issue in our community right now is that. So for me to see that people want access **just reaffirms that the vaccine mandate is something that we need to revisit,** because as the polling stood I was hoping to see a

question about the vaccine mandate, because that completely changes the game, right? You don't have access right now to the campus. So if you're a construction guy your guys can't get rained. If you're wanting to start up your own business you can't go there, if you're trying to learn English you can't go, and so I think that that's the biggest game changer for us right now."

30:59 **Answer from pollster**: "I want to throw out a word of caution here, which is anytime you're doing bond measures you want to stay away from lightening rod issues, right, things that are divisive in the community. Vaccines are divisive. You have some people who are, they want them gone, right. They don't want vaccine mandates. They should have all this access, and making that change would, might suit their needs. But on the other side you have a bunch of folks who really want them, and they want them in place. . . . Moreover, . . . depending on the demographic balance of your community, you need to pay attention to who the majority are and who the minority are. And in your case, just based on the electoral composition of your likely voter base, it definitely leans left, and that's the group that wants to see these vaccine and mandates in place. So I toss it out not because I'm saying one position's right, one position is wrong. I'm simply saying if we throw vaccines into the middle of this, its gonna have the effect of really pushing people away instead of building a coalition. So we gotta be careful about how that issue is treated.

Veronica Gallardo: 32:24 - 34:56 "Yeah, tl think that that's a good point. I think the conflicting message is going to be the the community college traditionally is a pipeline for a higher education for underserved communities, first Gen students, what not and I don't know Tim, vours seems to be in analytics and statistics here, so the research that just cam out, I believe it was Medical, Medicaid, and all of the insurance companies just presented all their data to demonstrate which populations and what areas are the folks that did not get vaccinated. Of course we were't surprised to learn that it was in fact minorities, low income families, communities that traditionally are served by California Community College. So I think that inn the opposing argument right now and I will be fully honest with you, I'm a Board member who will vote no on this bond as it stands because we have a really big access issue at the moment and so when we can't have our contractors and our small businesses and start ups and shoot ups who do generate business and keep our economy going when those folks are shut out of access to the college it creates a problem in such a small community that is so tight knit, and, and reliant on a California community college for upward mobility, and really job creation right? SO thank you. I think that the , you know, I wasn't surprised with access priority and CTE. I do think there are other issues too. I would have wanted to see some questions around the college's fiscal health and just to see how folks felt about that, f course the public isn't always purview to some of these conservations at the college level but in but own polling, and I compared your results to the work that Lew Edwards and EMC did for us with Measure S and that polling team above came in strong above 55%, and, and we were guaranteed to get that at that time. Of course they supported the measure, so we can go out as a unified voice and support it and do that. I don't see the support in the community right now. I really don't, and I see it much less than I did back then. Measure S. We did. I was hearing a lot of reasons why the community wasn't ready to support it, and I would say that has more than twofold doubled now I think now. So it'll be, it'll be interesting to see how things play out from here to there. So thank you Tim, this has been very informative."

[Discussion moves into whether to move ahead with a bond measure for November 2022 and the amount of a potential bond measure.]

Veronica Gallardo: 52:56. Asks about Strategic Plan - questions if will go in direction of putting critical race theories into policies, Community will know what direction college is going. 54:30 - 56:59 "As an example to a side deal that we make with the unions is everybody votes and pushes for a vaccine mandate and masking yet you're able to cut a side deal with the unions and say, Oh, but you don't have to wear a mask. So for parents in the community we're

asking them to add attached to their property and we're gonna say we're gonna mask your kids because we have this mandate but on the side we're going to work out a deal with the unions and goes what they don't have to wear a mask. So that's an example of the deals that we cut that the community, it just doesn't look good. I want us to be our best, and to do better for everyone, and to open up this college so it is truly an inclusive community for everyone. And Peter I think that the point that say oh well we tried to make our kid, your kid safe, well, unfortunately, Tim, yeah you know double vaxxed and boosted, I'm sorry you're ill and I hope and pray that you get better, cause its not a fun deal, right, so for us to make nonpartisan decisions, to do what's best for the community to rally everyone around this amazing college that truly can provide so many opportunities to everyone, we really need to do better and move forward and say we looked at all the information available, we want to make sure that we are inclusive of everyone, and we are making nonpartisan decisions and not be moved one side or the other because the reality is there are side deals being done. OK that is a hypocrisy to see [inaudible] up at the podium, taking off her mask in front of the entire public recorded on TV, yet everybody else's kid has to be masked and now we're going to say to the community, Oh, can you pass a bond, and can we touch your property but your kid can't come here because they're not vaccinated, and your neighbor, yeah, they can't get the construction tech training they need it. So those are clear true examples of what's happening in this community and so its not that I won't vote no on the ballot, Robert, what I'm saying is when we vote to put this on the ballot, Santa Barbara City College will go out not unanimously, which is not something we want to do, because we want to unanimously say that we believe that the community should invest 100 million, a 150 million, 300 million whatever that dollar amount it is, and right now, in good faith, I cannot tell the community that they should invest when we have not allowed them to enter and take part in a college that they belong at. We shut the door and that's the truth."

Robert Miller. . .57:12 - 57:33 "I don't know if you noticed this Veronica, but, and this probably won't change your mind, but I did note that your District, in your District *1%, 81% in the poll said they would support the bond measure on that initial question. It was the highest number of any of the districts."

Veronica Gallardo: 57:34 - 59:09 "Yes, it's true, and you know why? Robert because Latinos need access to higher education, but Latinos are not taking this vaccine and so I'm like you, I am not retired, and so I have spoken to mothers, I speak to them on a daily basis, I talk to my neighbors, these are men and women that are some of the hardest working communities, there a community of faith, they're hardworking, they have, they believe in values, they're conservative. You look at the churches every Sunday you go around and ask them if they're taking this vaccine. I have mothers telling me their high school graduates are still sitting at home, so you cannot tell me that you are going to upper access equity inclusion when you have shut out the majority of latinos out of that college where mothers cannot learn English because they can't go to class, where kids cannot go on campus because they don't have a vaccine. Those are things that are unacceptable. That library survey that we just received last week, I am surprised that that was even put up on video for people to see that we pay salaries for that level of service and after all the amount of money that we have spent on anti-racism, diversity and inclusion that that is the mediocrity of services we are providing to the community. It is completely unacceptable, and latinos are waking up. They're not just voting for whatever Democratic initiative that's on the ballot when their families are being shut out of this American dream that they immigrate into this country to get have."

Liz Auchincloss 1:00:19 - 1:01:07 "I just needed to correct Ms. Gallardo because there was not a back room deal made for staff not to wear masks. Staff still wear masks. Many of them prefer to wear masks because they want to protect themselves. So that just was not, that was not true. Staff do not, do not get to go without masks except with everybody who is outside. So I just needed to correct that because you used the generality of unions plural, and that's not true. From my understanding only faculty who are teaching a class can take their mask off during class. That's my understanding, but staff do not take their masks off. So please don't continue with that when it's just not true."

Veronica Gallardo:1:01:35 - 1:02:24 "Thank you Liz. [inaudible] . . . and for the record [inaudible] . . . and so Kindred you struck a deal with the faculty that they could take off their masks in the classroom so its not all of the staff, so the union faculty got to do that, so that's still wrong, and its hypocrisy and that's what the public looks at when someone's at the podium and Kindred you have the executive order, presidential order be able to say 'Oh I told her she could do that'. I'm not in favor of Santa Barbara College Board of Trustees putting a bond on the ballot this November 2022 for the reasons Marsha highlighted which I extensively went through all the way seven years back AND because I am not in favor of increasing property taxes for buildings that not everyone in the community would be able to access. So those are the two main reasons. Thank you for humbly sharing your families story. Having worked with a diverse student population, including students like your daughter, I am deeply empathetic and I am aware of what you are describing with regard to sensory.

I am copying interim Superintendent President, Kindred Murillo here. I continue to recommend a policy that makes SBCC open, accessible to all, and one that supports a culture where all students feel they belong.

Until SBCC moves in the direction of our neighboring sister colleges who have already opened their campuses to all students. I want to explore what we can do now to ensure your daughter is provided the differentiated supports she needs to fully access the SBCC Mission.

At the K-12 level we worked through this mask issue and I imagine we can do the same at SBCC for your daughter.

No student in our community should be experiencing the isolation you are describing. Please let us know what support we can offer now, until SBCC removes the vaccine and mask mandate.

On a final note, the college no longer requires students to be tested. I clarified this with Kindred at a board meeting a few weeks ago. Kindred confirmed all parents had to do to enroll their student was get the vaccine exemption and wear a mask. In your case there is something we should be able to do with regard to the mask. I have noticed the SBCC website is not up to date with regard to testing no longer being required. I communicated that to Kindred and she has asked for it to be updated.

Dear Ms. Gallardo,

I am writing in regards to the Covid 19 vaccine requirement, testing, and masking mandates that still remain in effect at Santa Barbara City College. These requirements are inherently unfair and discriminatory to unvaccinated students.

My daughter is currently a student at SBCC. She has autism and is a DSPS student. Because of her autism, she takes a reduced course load. My daughter has also had Covid and, therefore, has natural immunity. Because my daughter has autism, she processes sensory information differently. Mask wearing is extremely difficult for her. Because of SBCC's Covid policies, my daughter has not been able to attend in person classes now for almost 3 entire calendar years. She has been cheated out of a robust educational experience. Before Covid, going to in person class at SBCC was her main source of interaction with other people. Now, she is home, isolated, alone, taking online classes by herself.

The entire premise of the Covid 19 vaccine was that it "would stop the spread." We now know that the Covid 19 vaccine does not prevent infection and vaccinated individuals can indeed catch Covid and spread Covid. Moreover, the CDC itself has acknowledged that myocarditis and pericarditis are known side effects from the Covid 19 vaccines, particularly for adolescents and young adult males, age 16 and older.

In January of 2022, the CDC acknowledged that surviving Covid provides excellent

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natural immunity. The August 11, 2022 guidance from the CDC indicates that Covid 19 prevention recommendations no longer make a differentiation based on a person's vaccination status. Per the CDD, due to breakthrough infections and naturally acquired immunity, there is no reason to treat vaccinated and unvaccinated individuals differently.

Allan Hancock College in Santa Maria removed their Covid vaccine and testing mandate on May 31, 2022. At Hancock, masking is not required. In October of 2021, the Ventura County Community College District lifted their vaccine mandate and allowed students to choose between vaccination or testing. On August 10, 2022, the Ventura County Community College District board lifted their vaccine mandate entirely. At Ventura College, unvaccinated students are no longer required to test and masking is not required.

SBCC cannot truly be a community college for the entire community so long as these discriminatory Covid policies remain in place. I suspect that SBCC's problem with declining enrollment has a lot to do with SBCC's Covid policies. We are in a very different place than we were a year ago. It is time that SBCC adjusts to this new reality just as Allan Hancock and Ventura Colleges did. I respectfully request that SBCC update their Covid policy to follow the new CDC guidance and remove their Covid vaccine and masking requirements.

Thank you Kindred, yes this is a cleaner version to view. What's the plan? 55% for students is concerning, I think you'd agree...

How are students going to access the library & student services? There are two modalities to access library and student services - F2F and Online. If a student wishes to access F2F they will need to comply with the vaccine mandate. We have worked hard to help and accommodate student needs.

The community is concerned that we are nearing 90% in salaries & benefits & yet students can't access critical wrap around services etc.

Services are provided at the college sites. As I walked around the site, students were using those services in various areas. While I am working on trying to up the hours of services, my observation is we are still not seeing as many students as we have services.

How many student services folks including, library, & tutoring are on campus serving students? Staff will provide me these figures. I don't have these yet.

Can we disaggregate this data? We are a Hispanic Serving institution, what's the number of students that can no longer access a critical service inside an SBCC building? And no, the community is not sold on this idea that all can be done on-line. If so, are we looking at a reduction in workforce and moving toward serving students through smart technology?

May I ask who makes up the term community? Since I have arrived I have three community members contact me. My mobile phone number is all over the place, I try to respond to every inquiry I receive. Students are finding their way to me.

As we try to project the future of what students want, need, and will help them succeed, we will be looking at rightsizing the college and reorganizing to serve students in all the modalities they want and need. These will be face-to-face; online; and hybrid. Some students are loving the remote counseling services because they are more convenient. As we move out of COVID, we are creating a task force to consider these questions and thoughtfully answer them. We should have results of our student survey in the next week, and we are starting a student reengagement effort which will give us some more personal data. Most data I can have disaggregated except for some of the COVID data.

In my opinion, we do not do a good enough job of outreach to our Hispanic population and that is changing. I believe we should have a Puente Program here and other specific outreach to not only our high school population and we need to do more for our non traditional students who work in our community and want and deserve upward mobility. We just received a \$3.5 million HSI grant and I intend to ensure SBCC uses it to benefit our Hispanic populations.

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Kindred, you can imagine how troubling this is.

Pictures were floating around this week of an empty SBCC campus & the community is wondering what is going on, where are the students, where are the employees? There are times and spaces where you won't see a lot of students. As I walk about the SB site I witness classroom doors open with teachers instructing classes. We have a several outdoor classes. If the "community" walks over the Student Life, and the cafeteria there are plenty of students. Not sure when the "community" are at the sites. I worked a table this week where we had lines or students. There are students at the college. The fall is 25-31% in-person and spring is starting to look much more like it will be between 45 and 50%.

Adult high school is another percentage point that is beyond concerning, what's the plan there? These students need a GED, ESL courses, the conditions created under this mandate do not align with the values of SBCC. This is not who we are as a community. Students need to access in person services & classes. I know many of these students by name, and they are not just a number or a percentage. We continue to work on accomodating student needs. Dr. Scott, I, the Academic Senate President, and the Faculty Association President are working with our department chairs and faculty to ensure GED and IGETC are in all modalities. Carola Smith does an awesome job of ensuring ESL courses are in appropriate modalities.

As one example, you probably know K-12 districts are having a difficult time hiring, in person evening & weekend ECE classes would really make an impact to education right now.

Dr. Scott is working on an enrollment management strategy and important courses students need will be part of that plan. We are engaged in the Strong Workforce Program which helps us gage what occupations to support in our local community.

Have you given any thought to what Allan Hancock is doing, providing an exemption for deeply held beliefs, weekly testing options, removing the N95 mask, & instead adding a regular face mask, opening the campus for the students to use the facilities & attend their classes from SBCC. I only have so much authority under the vaccine mandate resolution. I exercise it carefully, within the parameters the Board of Trustees gave me. I give a lot of thought to every option and what works at one college doesn't always work well at another.

What is the plan to revisit this and provide the community with the all inclusive & accessible education SBCC once offered? I am doing what the Board has asked me to do. I take my instructions from the board as a whole, if the Board wishes to change directions, I am open to that. As much as I try to hear what every Board member says and represents, I learned a long time ago, I work for the board as a whole. I try to give good advice and recommendations, and am hired to ensure the college operates within the statutes of the State of California and adheres to Board policies and procedures.

Please provide us with answers to these questions.

Are you available this week to start meeting with the community? We have many beautiful outdoor spaces in Santa Barbara, and you can leave the college to go out and meet people. Helen did not prioritize this as her focus was internal college operations, and really her focus was the mandate. You don't have that same option & the community is expecting to speak with you. I can join you, our community is amazing and loves SBCC. I am working with the Board president on how these meeting should work. My first few weeks have been fighting fires to get through the vaccine mandate, get a spring schedule that is student friendly, and ensure this college is reaffirmed in accreditation. If you have some suggestions about where to meet 10 to fifteen people in your district please let me know. Jasmine and I will start working on that. I will also be scheduling an open offices hours for the community on Zoom so people who do not have access to transportation or difficulty attending meetings may have access.

Presidents come and go, you will be leaving before we know it & once again the community is left with more loose ends and questions. This has to stop, the impacts to these cycles of turnover is a waste of money that could be used for students. Let's make your short time here a meaningful one and one that can be viewed as short term investment. The community is ready to have a conversation. Your statement about president's coming and going feels very demeaning. My approach to SBCC to treat it like I will be here for the next ten years, because decisions I recommend will impact thousands of

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students and the Santa Barbara community for years to come. I have never left a college where it was not in better condition when I left than when I arrived. I am working really hard to make up for a lack of leadership at this college. Yes, president's do come and go, and we do make a difference when we do our job which I am doing. Yesterday I was told by a staff member that I have done more in five weeks than anyone in this position has done during last year and a half.

As I noted earlier I am a professional, and my expectation is to be treated as a professional. I have tried very hard to be respectful and will continue to do so because that is who I am.
