# **Overview: Types of Courses and Programs**

#### Credit

- Apportionment
- Units
- Tuition fee per unit
- Degree applicable
- Some developmental/basic skills
- Not repeatable
- Chancellor's Office approval

#### Noncredit

- Apportionment (two levels)
  CDCP, non-CDCP
- No units
- No tuition fees
- Limited to 10 categories
- Repeatable
- Chancellor's Office approval



# Overview Types of Courses and Programs (cont'd)

#### Not for Credit (fee-based)

- No apportionment
- Must be self-supporting, no general fund support
- Per course fee for instruction
- Community service education
- Local approval only

#### **Contract Education**

- No apportionment
- Customized
- Just in Time
- Paid for by business/organization
- Restricted enrollment
- Credit, noncredit, not-for-credit

- Immigrant Education (including Citizenship)
- Elementary and Secondary Basic Skills (including Supervised Tutoring)
- Health and Safety
- People with Substantial Disabilities

- Workforce Preparation

#### **Benefit to Students**

- Tuition-Free
- Repeatable
- Open entry/open exit options
- Accessible to all students
- Elementary level skills to precollegiate
- Bridge to credit and career
- Life enhancement





# **Before School of Extended Learning**

#### **Fee-Based**

- ~1000 sections annually
- Arts, Crafts, Performance
- Body, Mind, Spirit
- Events, Language, Photography
- Home and Family
- Nature, Science, Recreation
- Many eligible as Older Adult, Home Economics, Health and Safety in noncredit

#### **Noncredit Education**

- ~900 sections annually
- English as a Second Language (ESL)
- Adult High School/GED
- Short-term Vocational
- Workforce Preparation (CSI)
- Parenting



# **After School of Extended Learning**

#### **Fee-Based**

- ~ 250 sections annually
- Cooking & Culture
- Fitness & Recreation
- Languages
- Spirituality

#### **Noncredit Education**

- ~ 1500+ sections annually
- English as a Second Language (ESL)
- Adult High School/GED
- Short-term Vocational
- Workforce Preparation (CSI)
- Parenting
- Older Adults
- Home Economics
- Health & Safety

# **Extended Learning Concept**

#### Serves a diverse community population

 Combines all of the populations we currently serve and invites more

#### Integrates a mix of existing programs

- Tuition-free (noncredit)
- Fee-Based (CLL)
- Contract Education
- Off campus programs (ESL, Dual Enrollment, Cosmetology)

Implements a growth initiative focused on maximizing tuition-free courses, bridging to credit or career, and enhancing life skills



# **Extended Learning Programs**

#### Focus on Bridges to Credit

- Basic Skills and Adult High School/GED
- English as a Second Language (ESL)
- Vocational Programs
  - Industrial Technology (Construction, Welding, Other)
  - Environmental Horticulture
  - Allied Health & Culinary Arts
  - Business, Entrepreneurship, Nonprofits & Law
- *Transitions* for Ex-offenders



# **Extended Learning Programs (cont'd)**

#### Focus on Bridges to Career

- Focused on Career Skills that promote job attainment & advancement
- Workforce Preparation for adults with disabilities
- Bi-Lingual business program development

#### **Focus on Life Enhancement**

- Reduce Fee-Based Courses and limit to four areas:
  - Cooking & Culture (Travel Component)
  - Fitness & Recreation
  - Languages
  - Spirituality
- Older Adult programs
- Parenting
- Immigration & Citizenship

• Provides support to credit students primarily in English and Math

- Dual Enrollment
- Inmate Training
