Birth Certificates

California

- Must submit a Sworn Statement and notarized Certificate of Identity before the order will be processed, cost \$21

Out of State: Go to the birth State's website. Most offer the use of VitalChek services, you can avoid the VitalChek fees by applying directly to the state's Vital Records department (usually part of Department of Health & Human Services). If you have no picture ID, another person can vouch for your identity in some states.

California Identification

Once a street friend is housed they will likely still need support to maintain their housing. Many of the resources in this guide will apply to people who have been recently homeless but are now housed. This section contains some additional resources.

Adult Protective Services (APS)

Each county has an APS agency to help elder adults (65 years +) and dependent adults (18-64 who are disabled), when adults are unable to meet their own needs, or are victims of abuse, neglect or exploitation. County APS investigates reports of abuse of elders and dependent adults who live in private home, hotels, hospitals and health clinics when the abuser is not at staff member. (The Licensing & Certification program of the CA Department of Health Services handles cases of abuse by a member of a hospital or health clinic.) In-Home Supportive Services (IHSS)

Pays for services so that a person can remain safely in your own home. You must be over 65, or disabled, or blind. Disabled children are also eligible for IHSS. The second step, or a concurrent one, is to apply for a Section 8 housing voucher.

The Section 8 Housing Choice Voucher Program allows low-income households (voucher holders) to pay approximately onethird of their income in rent and utilities to participating housing providers. The remainder of the rent is paid through federal subsidies to the housing providers by HACSB. The waiting list is quite long but some priority may be given to:

"While the number of Veterans experiencing homelessness has been declining over the past three years, 67,000 former service men and women were homeless on a given night in 2011 as estimated by the VA. In general, Veterans have high rates of Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder, traumatic brain injury, and sexual trauma, which can lead to higher risk for homelessness. About half of homeless Veterans have serious mental illness and 70 percent have substance abuse problems. Veterans are more likely to live outdoors unsheltered — and experience long-term, chronic homelessness."

Call the local Social Security Office to see if you are eligible to receive Social Security disability benefits if you are disabled, and to see about receiving your social security if you are 65 or older; in some cases you can receive early retirement benefits at age 62. Supplemental Security Income: SSI makes monthly payments to people who have low income and few resources and are: Age 65 or older; Blind; or Disabled. Note: You can apply in person at the local office, online, or by a telephone appointment. If you would like help in applying, contact Casa Esperanza; if you are a patient of the CARES clinic, they will also assist you.

Eventually you will need proof of your Identity, but you can start your application before you have the documents listed here: The ID must be current (not expired) and show your name, identifying information (date of birth or age) and preferably a recent photograph. For example, as proof of identity Social Security must see:

- U.S. driver's license;
- State-issued no driver identification card; or
- U.S. passport.

If you do not have one of these specific documents or you cannot get a replacement for one of them within 10 days, we will ask to see other documents, including:

- Employee ID card;
- School ID card;

• Health insurance card (not a Medicare card); or

U.S. military ID card.

Tips:

-Get to know the person you are assisting so you can help communicate their experiences to the decision makers. -Help street friend keep all required appointments.

-Turn all paperwork in on time.

-Continue seeing public health/mental health professionals.

What To Do If You Are Denied:

If denied SSI/SSDI you should immediately contact a lawyer specializing in disability law to assist with the appeals process. If you do not appeal within the period of time you are given you will need to re-apply. If you have previously been denied but there has been a change in your physical or mental health conditions you may apply again.
