

SANTA BARBARA 2024-2025 Transfer Admission Guarantee (TAG) with SBCC

The Antioch University Santa Barbara (AUSB) Transfer Admission Guarantee (TAG) agreement with Santa Barbara City College (SBCC) provides an opportunity for guaranteed admission to any AUSB undergraduate program of your choice, provided you satisfactorily complete all the requirements listed below and any additional criteria required for admission that are in effect at the time you sign this agreement. The Transfer Admission Guarantee is currently available to any undergraduate student transferring from Santa Barbara City College. AUSB admits students fall, winter, spring, and summer quarters and the TAG is honored each quarter.

Program Requirements

All requirements must be met by the end of the term prior to the quarter of admission.

- Complete a minimum of 24 transferable semester units (maximum is 90 semester units)
- Complete the AUSB Breadth Requirement (20 semester units) or a fully certified General Education package (CSU GE or IGETC), with a grade of "C" or higher in English Composition (ENG 110)
- Earn a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.75 in all transferable lower-division coursework (note: students with less than a 2.75 GPA are encourage to apply through the regular admissions process)
- International students must also demonstrate English language proficiency through successful completion of the TOEFL, IELTS, or Kaplan's TOEFL. **See chart for acceptable scores.*

Deadlines and Procedures

- TAG agreements are available for all four quarters (Fall, Winter, Spring, Summer)
- You must sign and submit your TAG agreement 6 months prior to enrolling at AUSB
- The quarter of initial enrollment at AUSB is designated when the TAG Agreement is signed
- Your agreement is not valid unless signed by an AUSB Enrollment Services representative—you and your SBCC Transfer Center Director will receive a copy of the signed agreement
- All requirements for the TAG must be met no later than 15 days prior to the quarter for which you are applying for admission (i.e., by Sept. 15 for Fall, Dec. 15 for Winter, March 15 for Spring, and June 15 for Summer)
- If you miss any AUSB deadline, your agreement is automatically void

Student Responsibilities

- You are responsible for meeting all TAG requirements and notifying SBCC of any changes that may affect your TAG eligibility
- You must submit a written notification of any changes in your mailing address, email address, and phone numbers to the AUSB and your SBCC counselor
- You must submit an online application for admission to AUSB by the priority deadline for the quarter for which you are applying
- You are responsible for meeting all AUSB deadlines communicated to you through the AUSB Admissions Office

BA in Liberal Studies, BA Psychology, BA Management, BA Applied Studies, BA Applied Arts and Media, BS Applied Technology and Business Leadership

All information is based on the 2024-2025 Santa Barbara City College Catalog. Please refer to the SBCC-AUSB Breath Requirement Worksheet for courses that satisfy AUSB's Breadth Requirement. AUSB offers a BA degree in Liberal Studies with seven concentrations: Applied Psychology; Business & Entrepreneurship; Child Development & Education; Communication & Marketing; Environmental Studies; Professional & Creative Writing; Liberal Arts. There are no prerequisite requirements for the concentrations; however, AUSB recommends lower-division courses for students who wish to explore the subject matter at the lower-division level.

AUSB offers a BA in Psychology and a BA in Management. For the BA in Psychology, students should take PSY 100 or 100H or 120 at SBCC. For the BA in Management, students are recommended, but not required, to take either MGMT 101 or BUS 101 at SBCC.

AUSB also offers three applied degrees: BA in Applied Studies; BA in Applied Arts and Media; BS in Applied Technology and Business Leadership. Those degrees require at least 18 semester units of career/technical coursework in a cohesive area of study.

The BA in Liberal Studies, BA in Psychology, and BA in Management will accept a combined limit of up to 8 semester units of lower division physical activity and career/technical courses (if the career/technical courses include conceptual learning as shown by the catalog course descriptions and/or course syllabi).

Accounting Education (ACCT): all courses will transfer.

Addictive Disorders Counseling (ADC): all courses will transfer.

<u>Allied Health (AH):</u> all courses will transfer as career/technical credit toward an applied degree at AUSB. Combined limit of up to 8 semester units of lower division physical activity and career/technical coursework could count toward a liberal studies degree.

American Ethnic Studies (ETHS): all courses will transfer.

American Sign Language (ASL): all courses will transfer except ASL-150.

Anthropology (ANTH): all courses will transfer.

Arabic (ARBC): all courses will transfer.

Art (ART): all courses will transfer.

Asian-American Studies (ASAM): all courses will transfer.

<u>Automotive Service and Technology (AUTO)</u>: all courses will transfer as career/technical credit toward an applied degree at AUSB. Combined limit of up to 8 semester units of lower division physical activity and career/technical coursework could count toward a liberal studies degree.

Bio-Medical Sciences (BMS): all courses will transfer.

Biology (BIOL): all courses will transfer.

Black Studies (BLST): all courses will transfer.

Botany (BOT): all courses will transfer.

Business Administration (BUS): all courses will transfer.

Business Law (BLAW): all courses will transfer.

<u>Cancer Information Management (CIM):</u> all courses will transfer as career/technical credit toward an applied degree at AUSB. Combined limit of up to 8 semester units of lower division physical activity and career/technical course work could count toward a liberal studies degree.

<u>Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA)</u>: all courses will transfer as career/technical credit toward an applied degree at AUSB. Combined limit of up to 8 semester units of lower division physical activity and career/technical coursework could count toward a liberal studies degree.

Chemistry (CHEM): all courses will transfer except CHEM 101W, CHEM 155W, & CHEM 156W.

Chicano Studies (CHST): all courses will transfer.

Chinese (CHIN): all courses will transfer.

Communication (COMM): all courses will transfer.

Computer Applications and Office Management (COMP): all courses will transfer except COMP 161C.

Computer Information Systems (CIS): all courses will transfer.

Computer Network Engineering and Electronics (CNEE): all courses will transfer.

Computer Science (CS): all courses will transfer.

<u>Construction Technology (CT):</u> CT 104-125, CT 132-139, CT 194-196 will transfer as career/technical credit toward an applied degree at AUSB. Combined limit of up to 8 semester units of lower division physical activity and career/technical coursework could count toward a liberal studies degree.

<u>Cosmetology (CSMT)</u>: all courses will transfer as career/technical credit toward an applied degree at AUSB. Combined limit of up to 8 semester units of lower division physical activity and career/technical coursework could count toward a liberal studies degree.

<u>Culinary Arts (CA):</u> all courses will transfer as career/technical credit toward an applied degree at AUSB. Combined limit of up to 8 semester units of lower division physical activity and career/technical course work could count toward a liberal studies degree.

Disabled Students Programs and Services (DSPS): no courses will transfer.

<u>Drafting/CAD (DRFT)</u>: all courses will transfer as career/technical credit toward an applied degree at AUSB. Combined limit of up to 8 semester units of lower division physical activity and career/technical course work could count toward a liberal studies degree.

Early Childhood Education (ECE): all courses will transfer.

Earth Studies (ERTH): all courses will transfer.

Economics (ECON): all courses will transfer.

Education (ED): all courses will transfer.

<u>Emergency Medical Technician (EMT)</u>: all courses will transfer as career/technical credit toward an applied degree at AUSB. Combined limit of up to 8 semester units of lower division physical activity and career/technical course work could count toward a liberal studies degree.

Engineering (ENGR): all courses will transfer except ENGR-102.

English as a Second Language (ESL): only courses ESL 117B, 121A, 121B, 122 to 135, & 290 will transfer.

English, Composition & Literature (ENG): all courses will transfer except ENG 070,088 & 098.

Entrepreneurship (ENT): all courses will transfer.

Environmental Horticulture (EH): all courses will transfer.

Environmental Studies (ENVS): all courses will transfer.

Film & Media Studies (FS): all courses will transfer.

Film and Television (FP): all courses will transfer.

Finance (FIN): all courses will transfer except FIN010.

French (FR): all courses will transfer.

<u>Geography (GEOG):</u> all courses will transfer.

German (GER): all courses will transfer.

Global Studies (GLST): all courses will transfer.

Graphic Design and Photography (GDP): all courses will transfer.

Health Education (HE): all courses will transfer

<u>Health Information Technology (HIT):</u> all courses except HIT 284 & 285 will transfer as career/technical credit toward an applied degree at AUSB. Combined limit of up to 8 semester units of lower division physical activity and career/technical coursework could count toward a liberal studies degree.

Hebrew (HEBR): all courses will transfer.

History (HIST): all courses will transfer.

Honors: all courses will transfer except HNRS 100.

<u>Hotel Management (HM):</u> all courses will transfer as career/technical credit toward an applied degree at AUSB. Combined limit of up to 8 semester units of lower division physical activity and career/technical course work could count toward a liberal studies degree.

Interior Design (ID): all courses will transfer as career/technical credit toward an applied degree at AUSB. Combined limit of up to 8 semester units of lower division physical activity and career/technical course work could count toward a liberal studies degree.

International Business (IBUS): all courses will transfer.

Italian (ITAL): all courses will transfer.

Japanese (JAPN): all courses will transfer.

Journalism (JOUR): all courses will transfer.

Justices Studies (AJ): all courses will transfer.

Korean (KOR): all courses will transfer.

Latin (LATN): all courses will transfer.

Library (LIBR): LIBR 101 will transfer.

Mathematics (MATH): MATH 107, 108, 114-137, 138, 149, 150, 160, 180, 200-220 will transfer.

Multimedia Arts and Technologies (MAT): all courses except MAT-109 will transfer.

Music (MUS): all courses will transfer.

Native American Studies (NATA): all courses will transfer.

Nursing (NURS): all courses will transfer except NURS 190B-D, 195 & 282A-D.

Personal Development (PD): all courses transfer except PD 004 & 133.

Philosophy (PHIL): all courses will transfer.

Photography (PHOT): all courses will transfer except PHOT-215.

<u>Physical Education/Dance/Athletics (PE)</u>: all courses will transfer. Combined limit of up to 8 semester units of lower division physical activity and career/technical coursework.

Physical Science: (PHSC): all courses will transfer.

Physics (PHYS): all courses will transfer except PHYS 121W, 122W, & 123W.

Political Science (POLS): all courses will transfer.

Professional Development Studies (PRO): Only PRO 290 & PRO 292 will transfer.

Psychology (PSY): all courses will transfer.

<u>Radiographic and Imaging Sciences (RT):</u> all courses except RT-203 will transfer as career/technical credit toward an applied degree at AUSB. Combined limit of up to 8 semester units of lower division physical activity and career/technical coursework could count toward a liberal studies degree.

<u>Real Estate (RE)</u>: all courses will transfer as career/technical credit toward an applied degree at AUSB. Combined limit of up to 8 semester units of lower division physical activity and career/technical course work could count toward a liberal studies degree.

Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM): all courses will transfer.

Social Sciences (SS): only SS-101 will transfer.

Sociology (SOC): all courses will transfer.

Spanish (SPAN): all courses will transfer except SPAN 010.

Theatre Arts (TA): all courses will transfer.

Translation and Interpretation (TIS): all courses transfer.

Tutoring (TUT): no courses will transfer.

<u>Vocational Nursing (VN):</u> all courses will transfer as career/technical credit toward an applied degree at AUSB. Combined limit of up to 8 semester units of lower division physical activity and career/technical course work could count toward a liberal studies degree.

<u>WaterScience(WTRS)</u>: all courses will transfer as career/technical credit toward an applied degree at AUSB. Combined limit of up to 8 semester units of lower division physical activity and career/technical course work could count toward a liberal studies degree.

Work Experience (WEXP): all courses will transfer.
