After high school, I attended Santa Barbara City College, then Ventura College shortly before transferring to the University of California Santa Barbara where I obtained my Bachelor of Arts in Psychology and Sociology. Shortly after graduating, I began my career in the social services field with the County of Ventura, where I gained great experience working for the Human Services Agency as a Client Benefits Specialist working with individuals applying for assistance with Medi-Cal, CalFresh, CalWorks, and General Relief, a few years later transferred to In-

Home Supportive Services working as a Social Worker for individuals with disabilities helping them obtain care and support to remain safely in their homes. After five years, I transitioned into a Service Coordinator with the Department of Behavioral Health working with individuals with mental health needs currently incarcerated helping them find placement and treatment in the community and to help lessen the risk of recidivism. Education has always been an important driving factor in my life. I wanted to be able to help individuals who only sometimes saw a college education as a possibility regardless of their limitations. I am very excited and honored to be a part of the DSPS team at Santa Barbara City College, where I can put my years of education and work experience to continue to help and advocate for students.
